

BROTHER JAMES E. GIMILIANO, BETA UPSILON 3




BROTHER JOHN PHILLIP HULL, BETA UPSILON 15


BROTHER KENNETH L. MINCER, BETA UPSILON 22

BROTHER F. DENNIS RIEGELNEGG, BETA UPSILON 63




Frank L. Sturgeon, 68, of North East, died on Monday, May 4, 2020, surrounded by his family, in the comfort of his home.


